

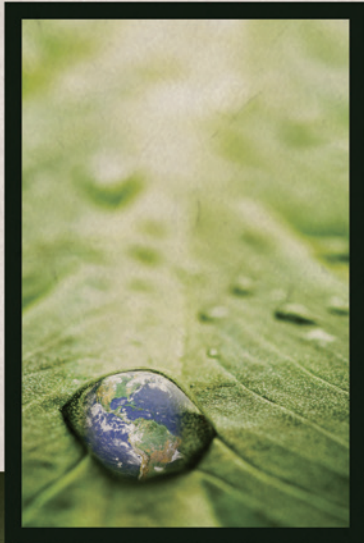

At present, when rain falls on impervious surfaces such as your roof and driveway, rather than finding its way back into the ground like it should, it runs off into storm drains picking up pollutants along the way. This contaminated water then discharges into our lakes, rivers and oceans. We're not only wasting freshwater, we're contributing to pollution levels, creating erosion issues, and perpetuating flooding.

When using harvested water for irrigation, your garden will also get the benefit of being watered with neutral, oxygenated water that contains no ammonia, fluoride or chlorine. Your plants will love it!

Financial Benefits

When we turn on taps and hoses to water lawns or wash cars, we increase our water bills and tax our municipal sources. On average 35% of a households water use is outdoors.

Those who don't pay for water now may find that they do very soon as only 2.5% of the world's water is freshwater and that number is quickly diminishing.
